

The use and impact of The Primary School PE and Sports Funding 2015-2016

In 2015-16 Prior Heath Infant School received £8,598 to develop provision in Sports and PE. PE has been a maintenance subject for 2015-2016 due to the successes of introducing inter-school competitions for KS1. Our 2015-2016 plans for the PE and Sport Funding are based upon our evaluations and analysis of PE in EYFS and KS1. At Prior Heath Infant School our aim is to use the funding to have a long-term impact on children's healthy lifestyles, physical wellbeing and achievement in PE. This funding was used:

Cost	Action	Impact
£717	To provide an afternoon "Golden PE club" for KS1 pupils.	The Golden PE club has been run by a T.A trained by SCL in the 2014-2015 year of funding. Working closely with the PE Leader a scheme was planned over a six week period focussing on fundamental movement skills and healthy lifestyles. The intervention has seen an improvement in pupil PE attainment, social skills and teamwork. In addition to this the pupils taking part looked forward to the sessions each week and they can also talk more knowledgably about healthy lifestyles.
£200	To provide CPD training for staff.	The funding enabled the school to provide CPD for teachers in a PE subject area of their choice. SCL coaches tailored CPD to teacher's interests and development points and this has had a positive impact on the quality of PE lessons and outcomes for the children.
£1084	To replace PE equipment and resources as needed.	The funding has enabled us to maintain active playtimes and resource outstanding PE lessons.
£518	To provide a children's PE workshop from an external sports coach.	The Reception children learnt new physical skills (skipping) from external providers and it provided CPD for staff. Year 2 children took part in 'Bike Ability' training.
£593	To continue to liaise with the Surrey Heath Learning Partnership and Active Surrey to maximise opportunities for staff development and participation in local competitions.	Co-ordinator release time enabled time for planning Year 2 multi skills competitions. Children had the opportunity to compete for their school. This has also strengthened PE links with other local infant schools.
£1986	To provide release time for the PE lead to monitor teaching and learning on 'learning walks' with visiting governors.	Learning Walks have enabled the PE lead and governors to monitor teaching and learning in PE as well as the impact of the funding.
£3500	To refurbish existing PE equipment to ensure pupils can access facilities in all weathers.	The equipment can be used in all weathers by Year R pupils contributing to continuing physical development.
