As the children have been working so hard at home and are now enjoying being back with their friends at school, we would like to make the end of the Spring term as enjoyable and exciting as possible for them. As part of our Easter celebrations, we have therefore organised two themed events that will be taking place in school during the last week of term.

### **Easter Bonnet Parade**

We would like to invite the children to make an Easter themed hat or head dress to bring into school on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April, the last day of term. We will then organise a parade (within our bubbles) to showcase their creations. This is entirely voluntary and if your child does not wish to take part in the parade, they can form part of an audience instead. ### **An Easter Eggshibition!**

We would also like to host an egg themed exhibition in school on the last week of term. From Monday 29<sup>th</sup> March, your child is invited to bring an egg into school that they have decorated at home. It may be a beautifully painted egg, an egg that has been turned into a character or a scene that includes a decorated egg. The eggs will be exhibited in the hall in our Easter Eggshibition during the afternoon of Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> March and each class will have the opportunity to visit. There will be 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes awarded for the most creative entries within each class. As we unfortunately cannot invite parents into school to tour the Eggshibition, we will create a video of the children's wonderful creations and publish it on Teams under the assembly tab. The children will be able to bring home their entries on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April, once the judging has taken place. Again, this is a completely voluntary event and your child does not have to take part. We have given you some ideas to inspire you, although I am sure that your child will have plenty of their own! For food hygiene reasons, can we ask that the eggs you use are empty. We suggest you use plastic, polystyrene or empty egg shells for this competition.



We hope that your child will be eggcited by the events that we have planned and, despite the current circumstances, we will continue to provide memorable experiences for them.
