

Literacy

Reading

Children will continue with weekly guided reading sessions with the teacher. They will be learning to retell a story in the correct order, using story language. They will answer questions about texts.

Writing

The children will learn to write their key words and will continue to write for different purposes. They will be encouraged to use capital letters and full stops.

Communication and Language

Phonics

Children will begin phase 4 letters and sounds as appropriate and apply this knowledge to their reading and writing.

Speaking and Listening

The children will continue to learn about how to be a good listener. The children will have the opportunity to speak and listen about different countries in small and large groups.

Mathematics

The children will learn to build and identify numbers to 20 and beyond using a range of resources. The children will be given opportunities to count on and back beyond 10 and notice the repeating 1-9 pattern. Children will use real objects to know that the quantity of a group can be changed by adding more or taking away objects.

Children will learn that shapes can be combined and separated to create new shapes. They will investigate how many different ways a given shape can be built using little shapes.

Understanding the World

People, Culture and Communities

Children have chosen to explore the following places around the world: UK, Europe, America, India, Africa, and Australia. We will be looking at famous landmarks. We will also learn about culture, religion, climate and animals in these countries.

The Natural World

Children will have the opportunity to go pond dipping to discover what lives in our school pond.

Past and Present

Children will learn about the seaside in the past and compare to the seaside today. They will share memories from past holidays and find out about where their family have lived or holidayed in the past.

Physical Development

Gross motor skills

Children will use different parts of their bodies to communicate imaginative ideas. They will remember and perform short phrases of movements to music from around the world. Children will develop their skills in using bats and balls. They will learn to throw, catch and aim using control.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

RE: The children will begin by looking at the school environment and why it is special before exploring the wider world and how we can help care for it.

The children will continue to follow the school's SEAL programme to support with building relationships.

Expressive arts and design

Creating with Materials

The children will be learning the skills to create artwork using a range of media and materials e.g. collage, paint and sketching. We will look at art from different countries.

Being Imaginative and Expressive

In weekly music sessions the children will explore how sounds can be changed from high to low. They will learn to control their voices and instruments to make high and low sounds. The children will develop their imagination and speaking and listening skills through role play in the airport.
