



Prior Heath Harvest Day Friday 15th October 2021

As mentioned in our newsletter dated 7th September, this year we will be celebrating Harvest by having a special day of Harvest fun. To help us celebrate this we would like the children (and staff) to come to school on this day dressed as something Harvest related e.g.:

- Farmers (jeans, checked shirt, flat cap etc).
- Scarecrows (dungarees/checked shirt, straw hat etc)
- Farm animals (this may include an animal onesie)

Although we would encourage all of the children to take part, dressing up is not compulsory and if your child is reluctant to do so, school uniform can be worn instead.

As part of this day, we will be asking for food donations for a local charity 'The Besom Camberley', who provide food packages for local families in need. If you are able to donate, we would be really grateful. Boxes will be placed outside each classroom on our Harvest day for your child to drop in their food donation.

So we don't end up with 180 tins of beans!!, we have asked The Besom Camberley what they are in need of at the moment and therefore have allocated the following food items to each class:

Class	Food items – please ensure all food items are in date!
Chestnut	Tinned fruit (in juice) Long life custard
Willow	Tinned Vegetables e.g. sweetcorn, peas, carrots and potatoes
Oak	Tinned puddings e.g. sponge puddings, rice pudding Packet puddings e.g. Angel Delight
Holly	Biscuits Cake bars
Cherry	Long life milk Long life fruit juice / squash
Rowan	Tinned meals e.g. macaroni cheese, minced beef in gravy, vegetable curry etc

Throughout the day we will be celebrating Harvest by enjoying an array of activities. This will include a visit from Bethany Wood, Outreach Children's Worker from St. Paul's Church who will be attending our special Harvest assembly. We will take photos of our special day and will share these with you after the event.

Thank you for all your support and I look forward to seeing all the children (and especially the staff!) dressed up on Friday 15th October and having lots of fun!
