Administration of the Governing Body

Operational and Strategic Business

Our school attendance remains fairly high although below the expected standard. Whilst there were continuing absences for health reasons, particularly as COVID does remain in varying disguises, there were an increased number of holiday requests during the school term time. Whilst some of this may be down to cancellations and re-arrangements (due to the pandemic) the expectation is that the 2022-23 academic year will return to normality and that attendance will be near to the 100% mark. Continuing education is essential for all children and at EYFS and Key Stage 1 we are giving the children the building blocks for their future. This can be achieved with consistent school attendance which helps the children and staff alike.

Not only has the year flown by but also the visit from OFSTED seems to be in the distant past although it was less than a year ago! Since that inspection we have seen Mrs Chivers put into place some significant plans to build upon the development priorities that were identified in the report. In addition the Governing Body is looking to re-appraise itself and become more focused on supporting the school and holding the school to account. We are reviewing the 'need' for meetings and looking at how we can make more efficient use of our time – this development is an exciting change for us and will be brought into place for the 2022-23 academic year.
