Administration of the Governing Body

Operational and Strategic Business

This is the first full academic year that we have used the new phonics system. All governors have experienced this during our visits and the feedback has been very good. The system has been embedded and we anticipate that the children will benefit from this scheme whilst developing and enhancing their learning.

In May of this year, we had a quality assurance visit from a representative from the Schools Alliance for Excellence (SAfE). SAfE work on behalf of Surrey County Council to coordinate a school-led improvement system. I'm pleased to report that feedback from the visit was excellent. The main areas that were looked at were; **Safeguarding** (noting that policies and procedures were up to date and that the school has excellent provision in place), **Early Reading** (highlighting the success that the new phonics scheme has already achieved with the pupils), **Quality of Education** (the representative spoke very highly of the level of education that he experienced on his school walk) and **Effectiveness of Leadership and Governance** (again this was highly acclaimed and confirms that we are continuing in the right direction). In order to receive such favourable comments highlights the success running through the school and, on behalf of the Governing Body, would like to express our thanks to our Headteacher and all of the staff at the school who consistently strive for the best for our children.
