Dear Parents.

It has been lovely to see the Year R children settle so happily into our school. The children in Years 1 and 2 have been wonderfully demonstrating our school value of responsibility by helping the younger children, particularly during lunchtimes.

Health & Safety within the school grounds

In order to keep everybody safe within the school grounds, please could I politely remind you of the following:

- Children should not play on any of the outdoor equipment before or after school. This includes the stage area outside the Year R classrooms.
- If children ride their bikes or scooters to school, they need to walk these through the school grounds rather than riding on them.
- Children should not walk or run through the staff car park unattended at the beginning or end of the school day. Children must be accompanied by an adult in the staff car park as staff and delivery vehicles use it throughout the day. Please use the pedestrian access at all times unless you need to visit the school office.
- Finally, children must not walk around the wall outside the office as it is very high and they may seriously hurt themselves should they should fall off.

Story sessions with Bailey the dog



We are incredibly fortunate that Bailey (Mr Stokes' therapy dog) visits our school several times a week to read with individual children. However, as there are 180 pupils at Prior Heath it is not possible for every child to have a turn. Therefore, Bailey is now going to be visiting classes on a Wednesday afternoon and will sit and listen to the end of day story with the children. As there are 6 classes, Bailey will visit each class once a half term. Please note, a risk assessment will be completed for these sessions. Bailey will be sat on his own mat during the story and will be kept on his lead at all times. If you would prefer that your child does not take part in these story sessions, please speak to the class teacher by the end of this week.

Parent Interviews

As mentioned in my previous newsletter, parent interviews with your child's class teacher will take place after school on Wednesday 18th and Thursday 19th October, with later appointments being available on Wednesday 18th.

You will be able to book your appointment online using the Parents Evening application within your ParentMail Account or through the ParentMail App which is kindly funded by the PTA. Please note, you will need to be registered on ParentMail to be able to book an appointment – if you haven't yet registered, please contact the school office.

Bookings will be open from **7.00pm on Monday 9**th **October** and you should receive an invitation to book parents' evening which will appear as a notification in your feed or menu. You will then be able to select a date and time that is convenient to you. Please note that bookings will close on Sunday 15th October. If you are unable to book your parents' evening appointment online, please contact the school office.

Each appointment will be for 10 minutes only, so if you feel that you will need longer, please see the class teacher concerned to make alternative arrangements. Due to the limited number of time slots available, there will be one appointment allocated per child; we are unable to offer multiple appointments. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact the school office.

Children in Need

This year we will be supporting the 'Children in Need' charity by inviting the children to come to school on Friday 17th November wearing their home clothes, preferably including something spotty or stripy, in exchange for a suggested donation of £1. Illness

At this time of year and throughout the autumn/winter it is usual to have a few cases of illness in school.

In order to minimise the risk of any other bugs spreading, please note the following:

- Children should not be sent to school if they are unwell.
- Children who have contracted a sickness virus and/or diarrhoea should not return to school until they have been free of symptoms for 48 hours from the last bout of illness, as advised by the NHS.
- If children are feeling unwell at school they will be sent home.
- Please remind your child of the importance of hand washing after using the toilet and before handling food.

If your child is absent due to illness or unforeseen circumstances, please leave a message on the absence answerphone, including your child's name and class and the reason for their absence, or speak to the school office by 9.30am on the first day of absence. If they are not well enough to return to school after two days, please inform the office again. Alternatively, absence can be reported using the ParentMail App.

Be Your Best: Active Surrey's healthy lifestyle support for families

Be Your Best is a children's weight management programme which offers families judgement free support to make small changes to improve each child's complete physical and mental wellbeing.

Families who enroll on the programme receive tailored one-to-one sessions, alongside online group sessions. These cover a wide range of topics including: becoming a more active family, portion size, managing screen time, positive body image and much more.

The Be Your Best programme is open to families with a child aged 0-12, above the healthy weight range, living or going to school in Surrey. It is led by Active Surrey in partnership with Children and Family Health Surrey and the University of Surrey's Dietetics Department.
