Administration of the Governing Body (FGB)

Each Governor undertakes a 4-year period on the Governing body which can be extended for a further 4 years. Occasionally, there are personal reasons for individuals to reduce their tenure which can sometimes result in a shortfall of Governors. Currently, we have 4 vacancies on the FGB – 2 are parent governor roles and 2 are co-opted governor roles (not directly associated with the school). The parent governor roles can be filled by grandparents as well as parents so if anyone has the desire, time and enthusiasm to support the school we would be delighted to hear from you via the Clerk to the Governing Body, Mrs Harris.

Operational Business

There were a number of school monitoring visits conducted by Governors during the autumn term and also an ongoing review of the school's finances. The day to day running costs marginally exceed the income received from the local authority and elsewhere (such as the hire of the school, letting of the bungalow, etc. and this is one reason why the school, as a whole, has looked for additional fundraising opportunities to focus on specific areas such as the library project. The small amount of reserves that the school currently has, will have to be utilised during the next few years.

Strategic Business
